

Beginning in February 2009, your television may not work.



The way American television stations broadcast will change from an analog (over-the-air) format to a digital-only format on February 17, 2009.

What does that mean to you?

If your television has a built-in digital tuner or is connected to cable or satellite, you should continue to receive broadcasts after the switch. You are urged to check with your service provider to be sure.

If your television is not connected to cable or satellite, or does not have a built-in digital tuner, you will need a converter box to continue receiving and displaying broadcast television. If you use "rabbit ears" or a rooftop antenna, you will probably need a converter.

Do you need a digital converter box?

If you want to keep your analog TV set and do not want to subscribe to cable or satellite service, you will need to purchase a DTV converter box (\$50 to \$70).

Can't afford the converter?

The federal government will offer consumers two \$40 coupons per household to go toward the purchase of these boxes. (One coupon per box.) Most major retailers such as Best Buy, Circuit City, Kmart, RadioShack, Target, Sears and Wal-Mart will accept the coupons.
